Anthony Bouza - Plaintiffs' Police Practices Expert.

Pete Ciarbellini, Humboldt County Sheriff Deputy – Sergeant of the Earth First Response Team. He will testify about giving the orders in the first two incidents to use pepper spray, and overseeing its use. Also about his orders from his supervisors about handling forest protests and the direct spraying and swabbing of pepper spray, discussions after the incidents, and the escalation of force by the Sheriff's Department in dealing with protestors in 1997.

Wayne Hanson – Pepper spray trainer at HCSD. He will testify about the scope and content of department training in pepper spray use, his knowledge about pepper spray, and discussions he had with supervisors about direct application of forest protestors with pepper spray. Also about his own first-hand experience applying pepper spray to nonviolent forest protestors.

Randall Held, Humboldt County Deputy Sheriff — Earth First Response Team, part of Special Services division, has been dealing with lock-down devices since at least 1990, and has personally ground out 30 to 35 protestors with a Mikita grinder. He will testify about his experience grinding out locked-down protestors without any injury, and his role in the incident in Scotia.

Kim Kerr—Ms. Kerr was the risk manager for Humboldt County when Chief Deputy Sheriff Philp was researching the legalities of direct application of pepper spray on nonviolent demonstrators. She will testify about her discussions with Philp about the risk to the County of liability.

**Deputy Marvin Kirkpatrick** – Part of the Earth First Response Team set up by the Sheriffs' Department in the fall of 1997 to deal with demonstrations. He was the individual who physically applied the pepper spray via Q-tip and direct spray in all three incidents. He will testify about his background with the Sheriffs' Department, his orders to use pepper spray, his training, his experience of using pepper spray on the plaintiffs, and discussions and debriefings with his supervisors after the incidents.

**Dennis Lewis, Ex-Sheriff** – Defendant. He will testify about his "get tough" policy with regards to forest protests in 1997, his prior experience with protest organizers, Humboldt

County's special treatment of arrestees associated with environmental causes, and his relationship with the Pacific Lumber Company. Also the authorization of direct application of pepper spray on protestors, Humboldt County's policies, the response from the public to his pepper spray policy, debriefing after the incidents, and pepper spray training.

Vernell "Spring" Lundberg – Plaintiff. Ms. Lundberg was swabbed with pepper spray by Humboldt County deputies at the September 25, 1997 demonstration in Scotia at Pacific Lumber headquarters. She will testify about her experience of being swabbed repeatedly with pepper spray by Humboldt County Sheriffs, her injuries and loss. She will also testify about her commitment to nonviolent political action, including civil disobedience.

James "Butch" Manos, Eureka Police Sergeant— One of the officers who approved the use of pepper spray at the Riggs incident, he assisted for the HCSO Earth First Response Team in applying pepper spray to Terry Slanetz, Maya Portugal, Lisa Sanderson-Fox, and Jennifer Schneider. He will testify about this, his discussions afterward with his supervisors, and the Eureka Police Department's use of force policy.

Michael McCurdy — Plaintiff. Mr. McCurdy was swabbed and sprayed full force in the face with pepper spray by Humboldt Deputies at Bear Creek on October 3, 1997. He will testify about this experience, its effect on his life, his background, and his commitment to nonviolent activism and civil disobedience.

Arnold Millsap – Chief of the Eureka Police, he was present at Frank Riggs' office after the pepper spraying, and signed off on the use by his officers of direct application of pepper spray to protestors. He will testify about Eureka's use of force policy, his pepper spray policy with regards to protestors, his work after the incident to publicly counter the widespread negative response to the practice, and the incident at Riggs' office.

Sam Neuwirth – Plaintiff. Mr. Neuwirth was swabbed in the eyes with pepper spray by Humboldt County Sheriffs' deputies on September 25, 1997 at Pacific Lumber headquarters in Scotia. He will testify about this incident and its effect on his life, as well as his commitment to nonviolent activism.

Gary Philp, Chief Deputy (now Sheriff) — Defendant. He will testify about his research into pepper spray use, his authorization and orders to the Earth First Response Team, Humboldt County's policies, training, his prior experience and relationships with protest organizers, follow-up discussion and debriefing after the incidents, and his department's desire to counter the growing success of civil disobedience by Earth First! activists.

Maya Portugal – Plaintiff. Ms Portugal was swabbed with pepper spray by the Humboldt County Sheriff and Eureka Police at Frank Riggs' office in Eureka on October 16, 1997. She was 16 years old. She will testify about this experience, its effect on her life, her commitment to nonviolent activism, and her background.

Lisa Sanderson-Fox – Plaintiff. Ms. Sanderson-Fox was swabbed with pepper spray by the Humboldt County Sheriff and Eureka Police at a nonviolent sit-in at Congressman Frank Riggs' office in Eureka on October 16, 1997. She will testify about her background, the experience at the Congressman's office and its subsequent effect on her.

Jennifer Schneider – Plaintiff. Ms. Schneider was swabbed with pepper spray on September 25, 1997 at Pacific Lumber headquarters in Scotia. She was swabbed a second time in another incident at Congressman Frank Riggs' Eureka office on October 16, 1997. She will testify about these experiences, her commitment to peaceful political activism as a spiritual practice, and the impact of the excessive force caused by defendants.

Terri Slanetz – Plaintiff. Ms. Slanetz was swabbed and directly sprayed in the eye by Humboldt County Sheriff and Eureka Police Department at Frank Riggs' office on October 16, 1997. She will testify about this experience and its effect on her life. Also her lifelong commitment to nonviolent political activism and community organizing.

Noel Tendick – Plaintiff. Mr. Tendick was swabbed and sprayed full force in the face with pepper spray by Humboldt deputies at Bear Creek on October 3, 1997. He will testify about this experience, its effect on his life, his background, and his commitment to community organizing and nonviolent social change.
